#### ZEPPELIN RIDES HERE

Did you ever wonder what it would be like to fly in a zeppelin? You can check that one off your "bucket list" right here between August 16-21 by purchasing a 45-minute flight on the Farmer's Insurance zeppelin, the only one operating in the U.S.

The zeppelin is slightly longer than a Boeing 747 and, unlike blimps, has a rigid structure that permits the engines to be mounted up high to provide a quiet ride and a full 360-degree panoramic view.

#### RUNWAY CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Runway 12R/30L reconstruction continues on schedule with estimated opening around the 1<sup>st</sup> of Oct. After a 30-day cure period, the runway will be closed again for approximately a week to allow grooving and final painting. When completed, the runway will be 150' wide and capable of supporting Boeing 757s.

#### **GRIZZLIES' FIREWORKS AUGUST 5**

The Grizzlie's GCS Ballpark will conduct a fireworks display at the end of their game (around 9 p.m.) on August 5. Use caution as the fireworks will be approximately 300 feet north of the Runway 30R extended centerline and 1,250 feet short of the threshold, with peak fireworks altitudes of 350-400 feet AGL.

Their final fireworks night of the season is set for Sept. 4<sup>th</sup>.

Adam Young, the "Voice of the Gateway Grizzlies" narrated the show and Izzy the Grizzly stopped in to help entertain the crowd.


Thanks to Fair St. Louis and Jet Aviation, there were plenty of shade, cold water, and even complementary freezer pops to keep the people cooled off.
