JULY 4 AIRSHOW ACTIVITES

Our airport will once again be the base of operations for the Fair St. Louis Air Shows on the Gateway Arch Riverfront. Here's the schedule of activities as currently planned:

Tuesday, July 3rd:

12:00-15:00—Practice show on the riverfront.

19:00-Golden Knights jump into Busch Stadium.

Wednesday, July 4th:

- 10:00-B-17 flies down Market Street over the VP Parade.
- 10:00—Volunteers in place at the airport.
- 10:30-Airport gates open to our special needs guests.
- 12:00-14:30-Dual air shows (at the riverfront for the general public and at the airport for those with special needs.)

15:30-17:15—Air Show at the riverfront.

19:00-Golden Knights jump into Busch Stadium.

Saturday, July 7th:

21:00-21:15-Beech 18 aerobatics before the fireworks.

The list of air show performers include the US Army Golden Knights skydiving team; the AV-8B Harrier; The Aeroshell Team of four T-6s; Bob Carlton in his jet-powered sail plane; the Iron Eagles (two Christen Eagle biplanes); Rob Holland in his MX-2; John Mohr in his Stearman; Gene Soucy & Theresa Stokes wingwalking; John Klatt in his Staudacher; Matt Younkin in his Twin Beech D-18; Skip Stewart in his Pitts biplane; EAA's B-17 bomber; and other military fly-bys, as available.

Riverfront concerts and other activities will continue on both sides of the river on Friday and Saturday, July 6 & 7, with the ReMax hot air balloon and a powered parachute at the Malcolm Martin Memorial Park (the Gateway Geyser on the east side.)

As a reminder, the Special Needs Air Show at the airport is NOT open to the general public so that our fans with special needs and their families can better experience the air show activities. MOTION-INDUCED BLINDNESS

We've all heard of auto accidents where a car pulls out in front of a motorcycle and the driver states after the accident that he didn't see the other vehicle. That could be true and it could have been caused by motion-induced blindness.

When flying, it's extremely important to scan the horizon for a short distance while looking for other aircraft and then stop the scan momentarily before moving on to another location. Pilots should repeat the process and should not fix their gaze for more than a couple of seconds at any single point. Keep your head out of the cockpit and your eyes moving to avoid a mid-air collision.
