<u>LOCAL PILOT TO ESTABLISH</u> <u>A WORLD FLIGHT RECORD ON JULY 4</u>

Local EAA chapter member, Air Force Veteran, and two-time brain cancer survivor, Brian Kissinger, will attempt to establish his third Aviation World Record during a flight that will end here just before noon, July 4th, at the start of the Fair St. Louis "Special Needs" Air Show.

Brian will depart at 6:37 a.m. for a flight to St. Joseph, Missouri, and return at the start of the noon air show. He and his aircraft, an Experimental Sonerai II, will be on static display during the show and he will fly in the second show that day at the Gateway Arch Riverfront.

Brian and his aircraft will also be on static display at the Malcolm Martin Memorial Park (the Gateway Geyser fountain park on the east riverfront) on Friday and Saturday evenings, July 6 and 7, from 6 to 8:30 p.m.

Brian's third World Record attempt is not just for fun or to set a new personal best, but to raise awareness and funds to help Homeless Veterans. Only 11 percent of our Nation's population are Veterans, however, Veterans comprise 25 percent of the homeless population.

"Love God and Help People" is the simple message Brian hopes to highlight as he flies, again, into the record books.


The Fédération Aéronautique Internationale and National Aeronautic Association will sanction and certify this new World and National Aviation Record for speed over a recognized course.

Yes, that's right. I wrote and published a book. From the Sandbox to the Clouds is an easy-reading autobiography that chronicles my journey from a Cessna 150 to supersonic flight and back. It covers my participation in military operations in war zones and peaceful flights at



thirty miles per hour in my powered parachute. My civilian career is covered from my teenage years working as a "lineboy" at this airport to pay for flying lessons, to my current position as airport director.

My dream of flying began as a child in a sandbox and propelled me into the clouds. It is a flying story, a war story, and a bit of a love story, as it illustrates the sacrifices required of military families. Hopefully, it will inspire others to dream what may seem impossible, to believe those dreams are achievable, and to reach out and fulfill them.

All proceeds from books sold at *The Greater St. Louis Air & Space Museum* are retained by the museum to fund their activities.
