MUSEUM RECEIVES NATIONAL AWARD

The American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA) recently selected the Greater St. Louis Air and Space Museum for their 2013 Civic Service Award. Museum leaders were presented the award May 23rd at a dinner banquet of the Engineers Club of St. Louis.

According to the AIAA, the award is in recognition of the museum's efforts to preserve and promote historic air and space artifacts as well as instilling the spirit of flight in today's youth.

Congratulations to our Museum team and to those of you who have supported it through the years.

If you haven't visited the Museum recently, it's time for you to visit and see the great things going on there. In addition to the many great aviation and space artifacts on display, their fleet of simulators includes fully functioning Link, GAT-II and F-4 Phantom simulators, in addition to desktop computer-based simulators.

The GAT-II has been used to train aviation students in the hazards and recovery from spatial disorientation and the F-4 simulator includes a full-sized functioning Phantom cockpit and visual system.

In addition to serving as a base of operations for many Young Eagle flights conducted by our Experimental Aircraft Association Chapter 64, the Museum is the focal point for many other events.

The Museum will host an open house, BBQ, and Fly-in on Saturday, June 15th and will also host EAA's B-17 Aluminum Overcast July 2-4, during an Air Tour stop and its participation in the Fair St. Louis Riverfront and Airport Air Shows. FAIR ST LOUIS AIR SHOW INFORMATION

You won't want to miss this year's exciting Fair St. Louis Air Shows. Due to the planned reconstruction of the Gateway Arch Riverfront, this will most likely be the last year for the riverfront air shows until at least 2016.

This year's festivities will begin with the arrival of the B-17, Tuesday morning, July 2nd. The aircraft will be parked on the west ramp by the Greater St. Louis Air and Space Museum and flights and ground tours will be available.

Wednesday will be media and practice day with practice flights over the Gateway Arch Riverfront between noon and 2 p.m. Tune in to KMOX radio from 9 to 11 a.m. to hear *The Charlie Brennan Show* broadcast directly from our air show ramp.

There will be two Riverfront Air Shows on July 4th and 5th, at noon and 4 p.m.

Saturday, July 6th will be a very special day, with a free airshow at the airport at noon just for air show fans with special needs. Special needs fans of all ages are welcome to come with their immediate families and caregivers to meet the performers and experience the show. American Sign Language translators will be available and other special accommodations are planned to assist our special fans.

Note that this air show is NOT open to the general public. Able-bodied fans should attend the shows at the riverfront or call Diane Earhart in the airport office to volunteer to help with the show. We need many volunteers to make this a safe and successful event.

The final Riverfront air show will be Saturday evening at 5 p.m. and will be followed by concerts and fireworks. No Fair St. Louis activities are planned for Sunday.

Due to Sequestration, no military aircraft are flying in air shows anywhere this summer and many air shows have been canceled. However, the line-up here this year is still a great one. B-17 RIDES AVAILABLE HERE IN JULY

EAA Chapter 64 is offering historic flight experiences in the EAA's beautifully restored B-17G Flying Fortress "Aluminum Overcast." One of only 13 Fortresses still flying, this aircraft is an icon of the Allied strategic bombing effort that helped turn the tide of battle in World War II. Unlike reading a history book, you can actually fly a mission back in time and feel the might of this magnificent machine, just as those brave young men did more than 60 years ago. Your Flight Experience will last approximately one hour, including briefing, debriefing and about 24 minutes of actual flight time.

FIREWORKS NEAR YOUR FLIGHT PATH!

The Gateway Grizzlies minor league ball team will conduct a 7-minute long fireworks display immediately south of the GCS Ballpark at the end of their game on the following dates: June 1 (approx. 10 pm), July 3 & 4 (approx. 9 pm), August 9 (approx. 10 pm), and September 1 (approx. 9 pm).

When fireworks are scheduled, Runway 12L/30R will be NOTAMed closed from 9:30 to 11 p.m. (8:30 to 10 p.m. for 9 p.m. game starts.)

The fireworks display will be centered on the final approach to runway 30R with peak firework altitudes of 350 to 400 feet AGL. In reference to the primary runway, runway 12R/30L, the fireworks will be approximately 1,250 feet north of the extended centerline of runway 30L and approximately 1,250 feet short of the threshold.

Use extreme caution during these times and report any problems caused by the display to the Airport Management in writing.
