**FIRE STATION RIBBON CUTTING**



A large crowd gathered on the morning of January 24<sup>th</sup> for the grand opening of the airport's new fire station and emergency operations center.

In addition to housing the airport's aircraft rescue and firefighting vehicles, the station includes an Airport Operations Center (AOC) and a hardened Emergency Coordination Center (ECC.)

The AOC will initially be staffed from 0800 to 2100 seven-days-a-week to monitor security and airfield conditions, conduct airfield inspections and wildlife abatement activities, and publish airfield NOTAMs. The ops center can be reached by telephone at 618-337-7478. When the airport administration office is closed, calls to the office number, 337-6060, will also be routed to the ops center.

The ECC, located in the very center of the building, is designed to withstand earthquakes or tornados and continue to function on back-up power. This multi-purpose room can be configured in a variety of layouts to accommodate training classes, meetings, and conferences as well as regional emergency managers in times of crisis.

We are very proud of the new facility and welcome visitors. Call or stop by for a tour. Because it is a secure facility, the front door may be locked. Use the call box by the door to call for entry.

**RECORD FLIGHT TO & FROM CPS**
